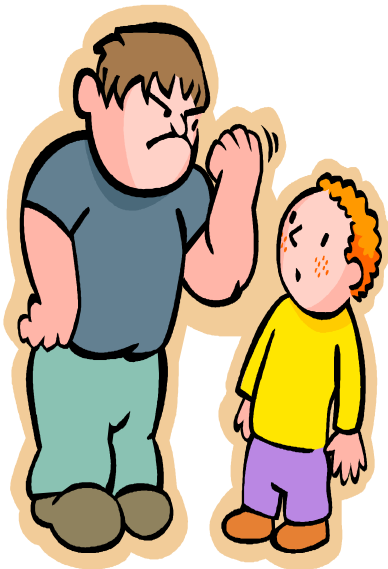

Conflict Crises

Are you and a friend having a hard time solving a conflict?

Are you or a friend being bullied? If you answered yes to either of these questions you should either fill out a bully report or talk to a peer mediator. Bully reports are available in the office and can be confidential if requested. Another solution is to talk to a peer mediator. Peer mediators are other students who are

there to help you. They are there to listen and help find a solution to your problem. Everything said during a peer mediation session is completely private. It's a great way to solve a conflict and let off some steam. Don't forget, conflict is usually caused by miscommunication, so don't be afraid to talk it out.
